

Installation Precaution:

- ① To prevent possible electrical shocks due to potential failure, the unit must be Earthed adequately.
- ② Provide a power circuit exclusively for each unit, and supply a circuit breaker for the correct current and an Earth Leakage Circuit Breaker (ELCB) protector should be provided for each unit.
- ③ All wiring must be done in accordance with the wiring system diagram, and in accordance to Australian Standards.
- ④ Wrong wiring may cause the unit to malfunction or become damaged.
- ⑤ Please disconnect the power plug or cut off the power supply when not in use.

Operation mechanism

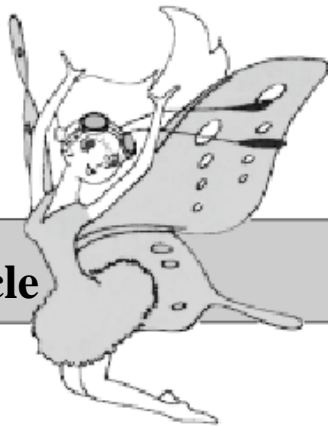
Cooling cycle



Connected via pipes, indoor unit and outdoor unit form a refrigeration system. With power, compressor takes in low temperature and low pressure refrigerant then commences to compress the liquid gas which is now vaporised into the evaporator of indoor unit, compressing the gas into high temperature and high pressure gas, then discharging this gas into the condenser of outdoor unit. Helped by an axial-flow fan, heat is removed to outdoor air from the gas which then re-condenses back into liquid, the flow of liquid is now controlled, and the liquid starts to drop temperature and pressure. There, helped by another cross-flow fan, the liquid now absorbs heat from room air, evaporates and becomes low pressure vapour which then flows into compressor again, beginning next cooling cycle. Therefore, heat is transferred from indoor to outdoor, and room gets cooler and cooler.

Ventilation cycle



Ventilation cycle activates and divides the indoor and outdoor into two parts. With air movement provided by the cross-flow fan, room air continues to flow through filters, exchanges heat in evaporator, then returns to the room. In this way, room air can be cooled and dehumidified. At the same time, filtering the room air.



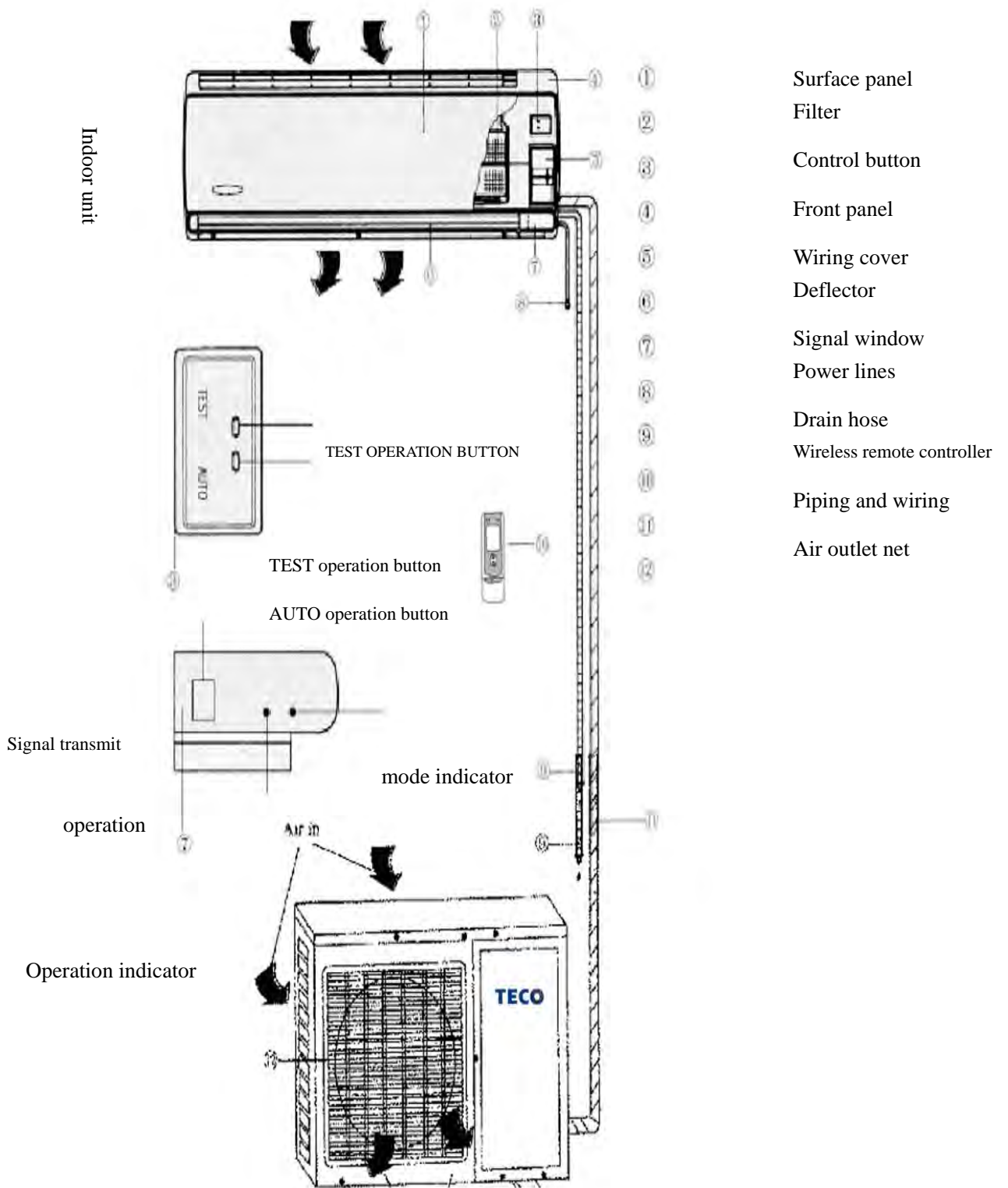
Heating cycle

TECO's Reverse Cycle type air conditioners use a reversing valve (4-way electromagnetic valve) to change refrigerant flow direction. When heating, refrigerant firstly enters indoor heat-exchanger, releasing heat and condensing. Then it enters the outdoor heat-exchanger, absorbing heat and evaporating. Because power consumption is used and converted into heat which is discharged in room, heating efficiency is very good, which means it saves you money. Reverse Cycle heating is the cheapest form of home heating today.

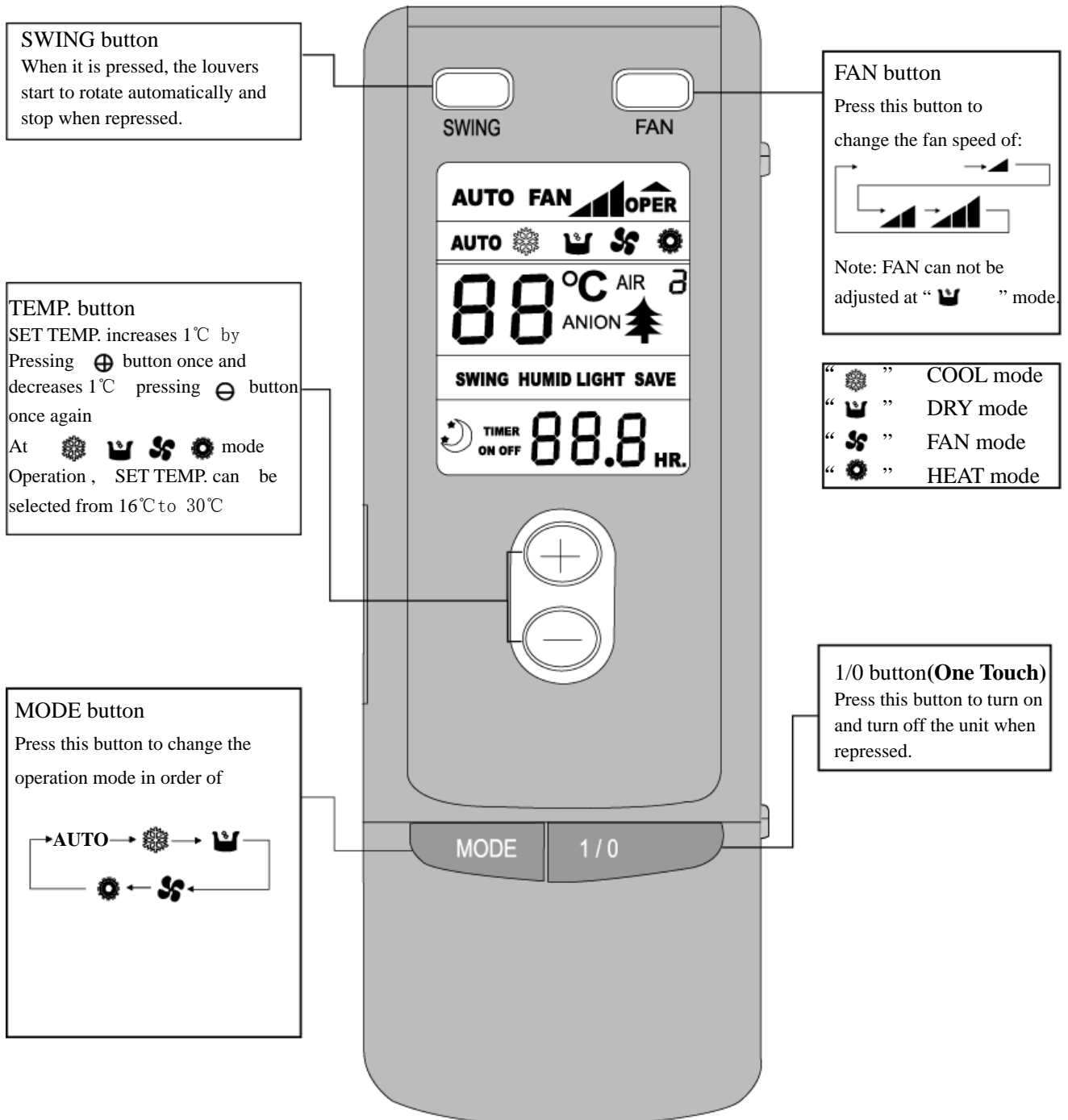

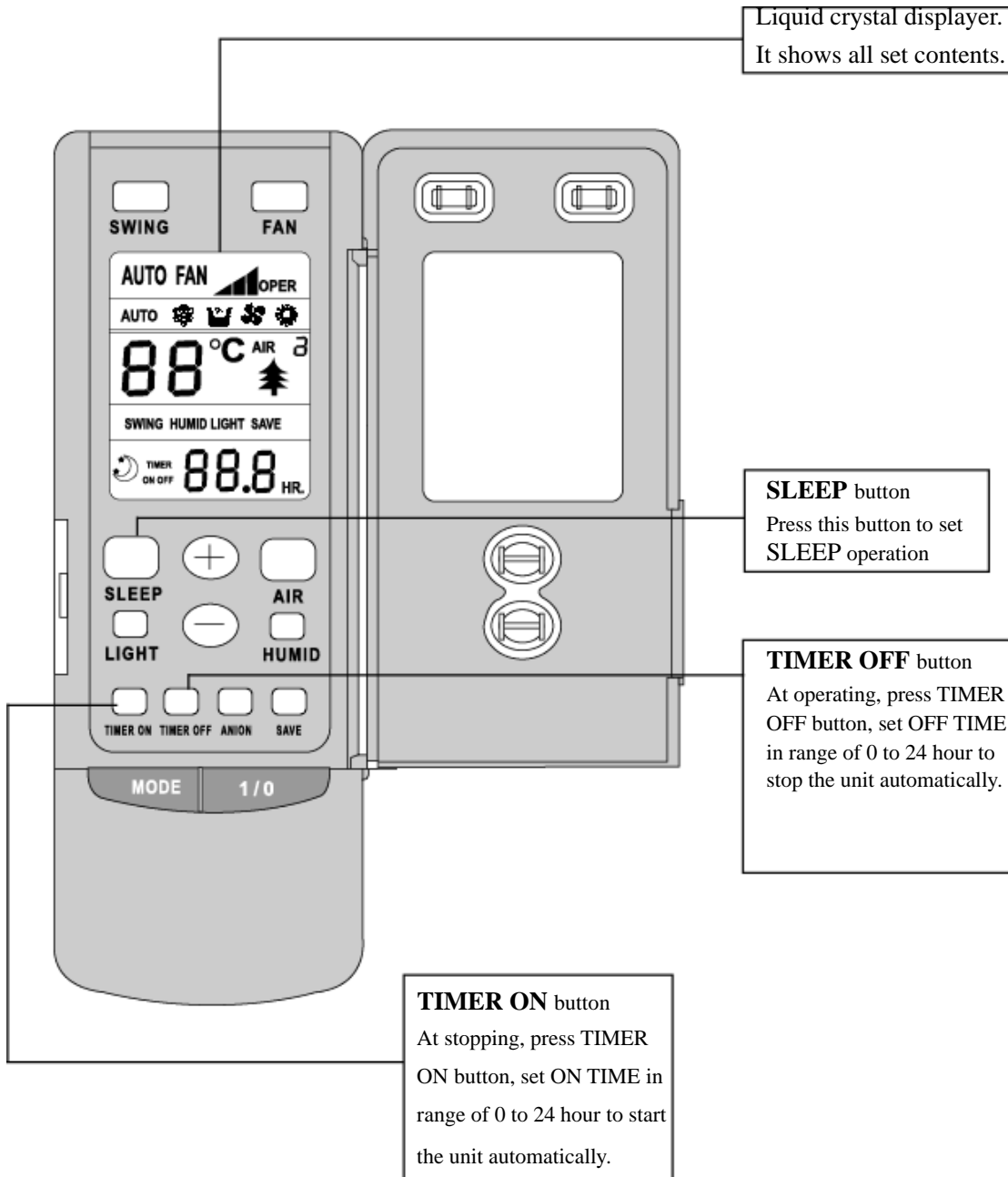

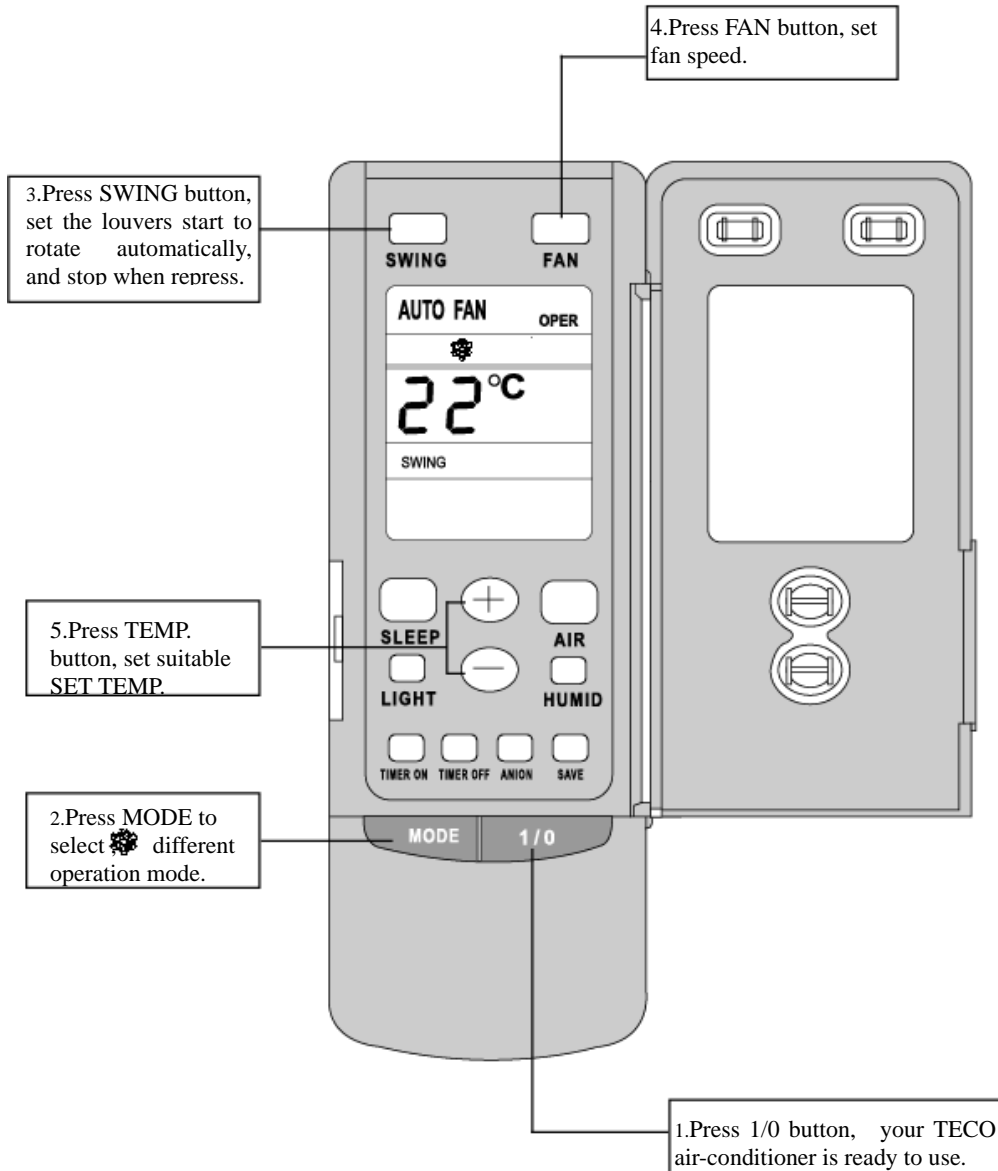

COOL mode operation procedure

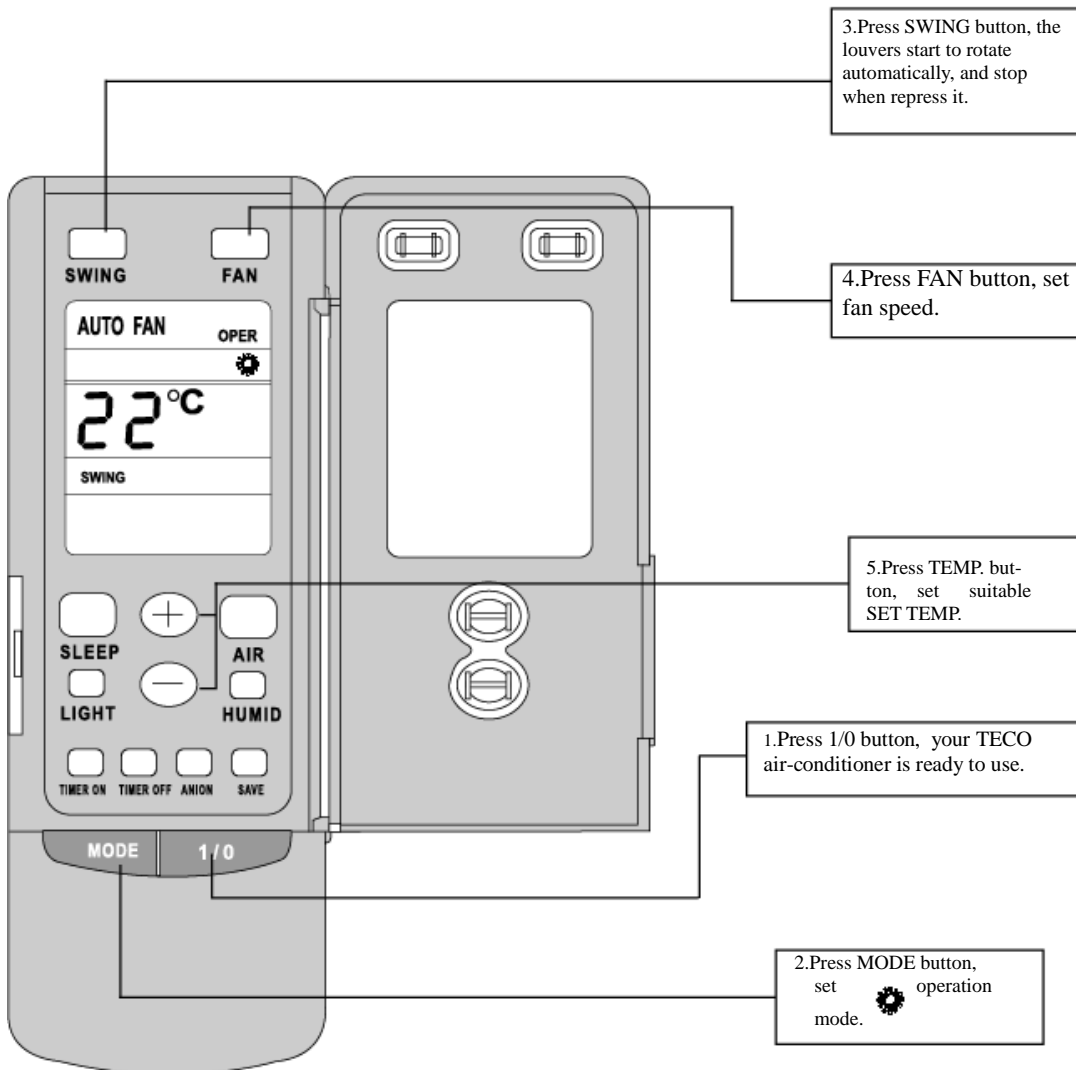
According to difference between room temperature and the "Set Temperature" the microcomputer can control cooling on or not:

- If room temp. is higher than set temp., compressor runs at COOL mode.
- If room temp. is lower than set temp., compressor stops and only indoor fan motor runs.
- SET TEMP. should be in range of 16 to 30 .



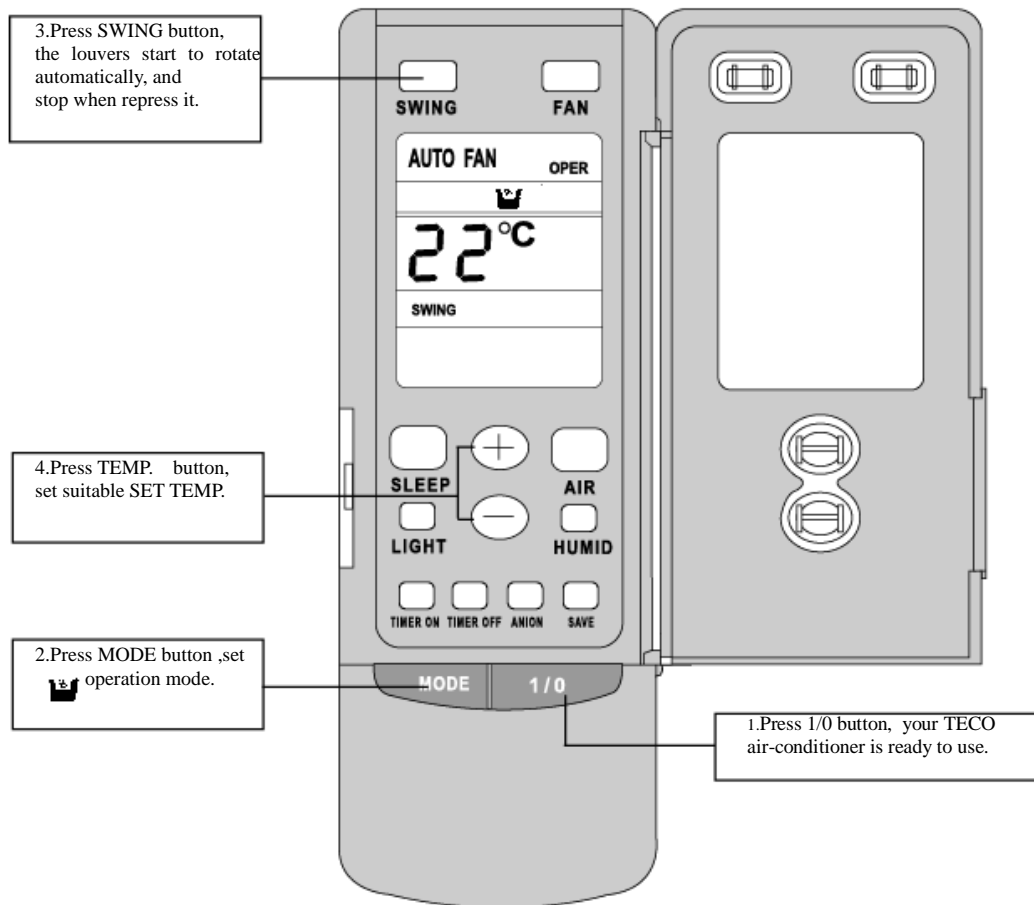
HEAT mode operation procedure

- If room temp. is lower than set temp., compressor runs at HEAT mode;
- If room temp. is higher than set temp., compressor and outdoor fan motor stop, only indoor fan motor runs.
- SET TEMP. should be in range of 16°C to 30°C.



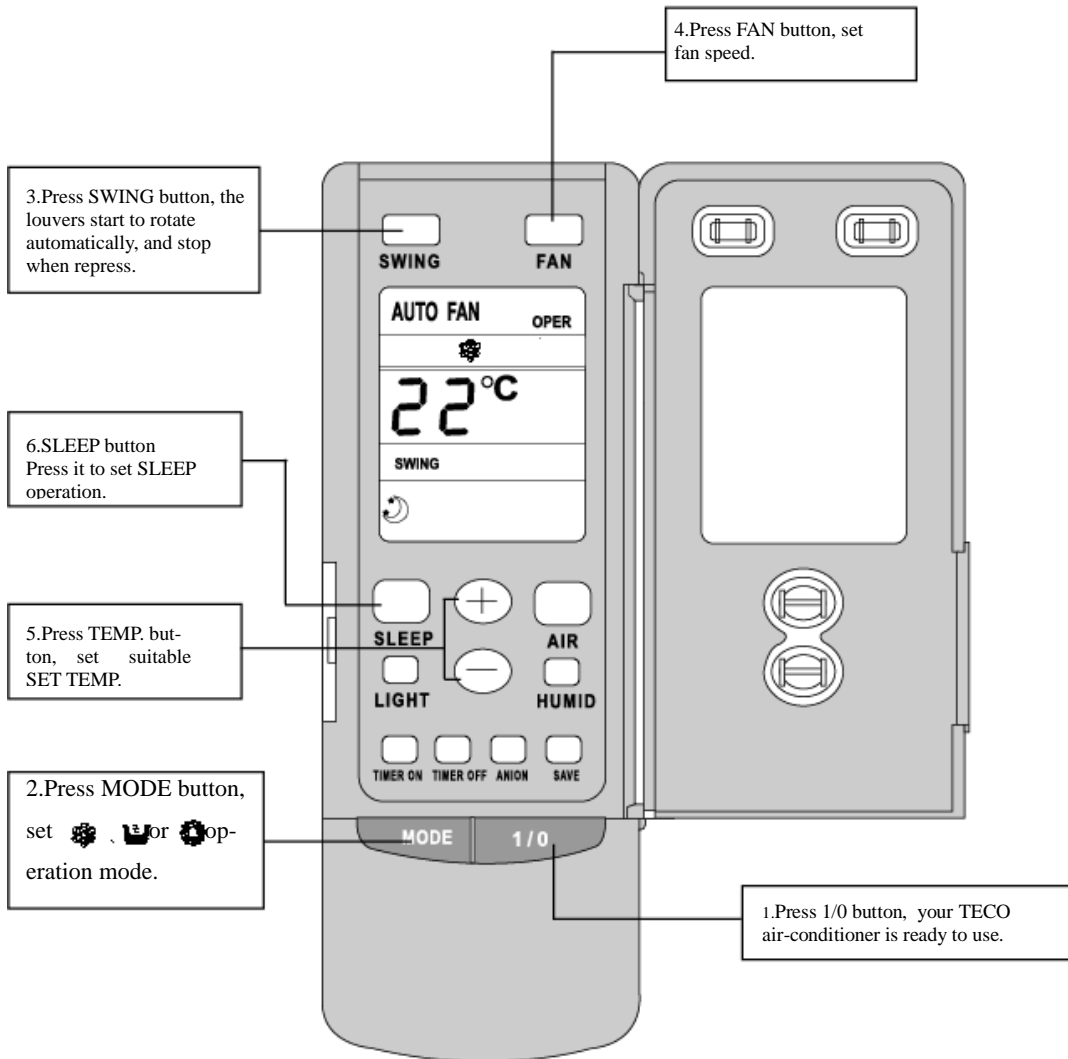
DRY mode operation procedure

- If room temp. is lower than set temp., compressor , outdoor and indoor fan motor stop. If room temp. is between $\pm 2^{\circ}\text{C}$ of set temp., Air conditioner is drying. If room temp. is higher than set temp., it's at COOL mode.
- SET TEMP. should be in range of 16°C to 30°C .



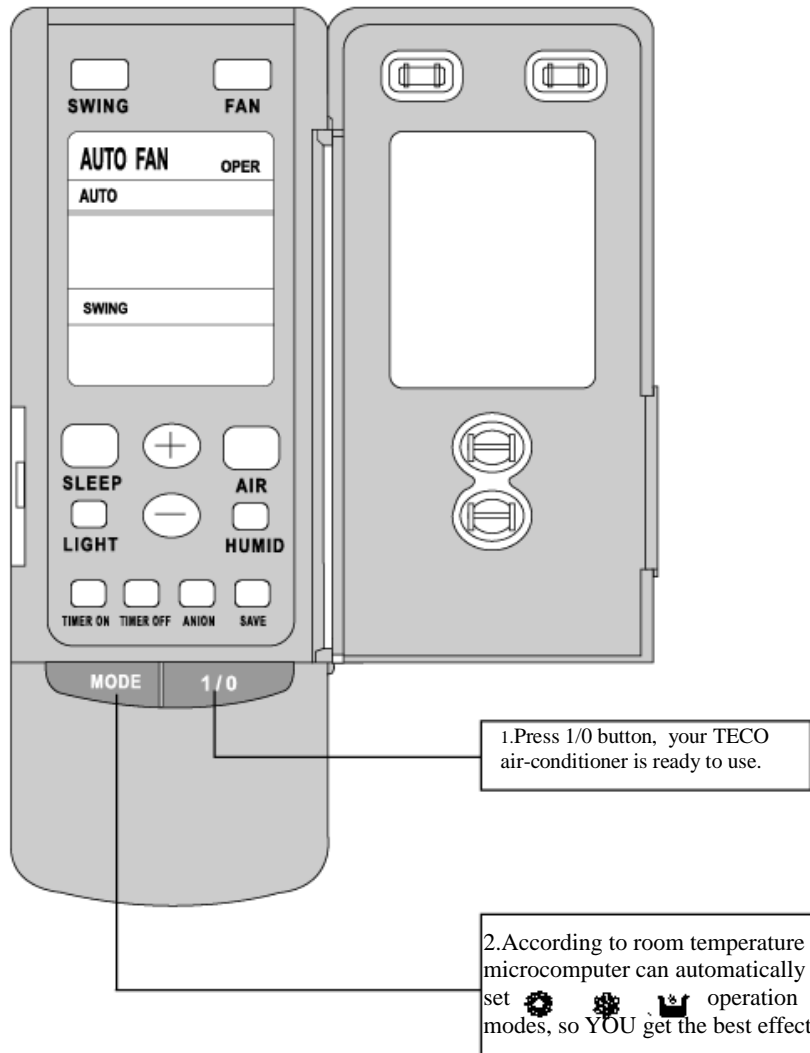
SLEEP mode procedure

- When the unit is cooling or drying, if SLEEP operation is set, SET TEMP. would increase 1°C in 1 hour and 2°C in 2 hours. Indoor fan motor runs at low speed.
- When the unit is heating, if SLEEP operation is set, SET TEMP. would decrease 1°C in 1 hour and 2°C in 2 hours. Indoor fan motor runs at low speed.

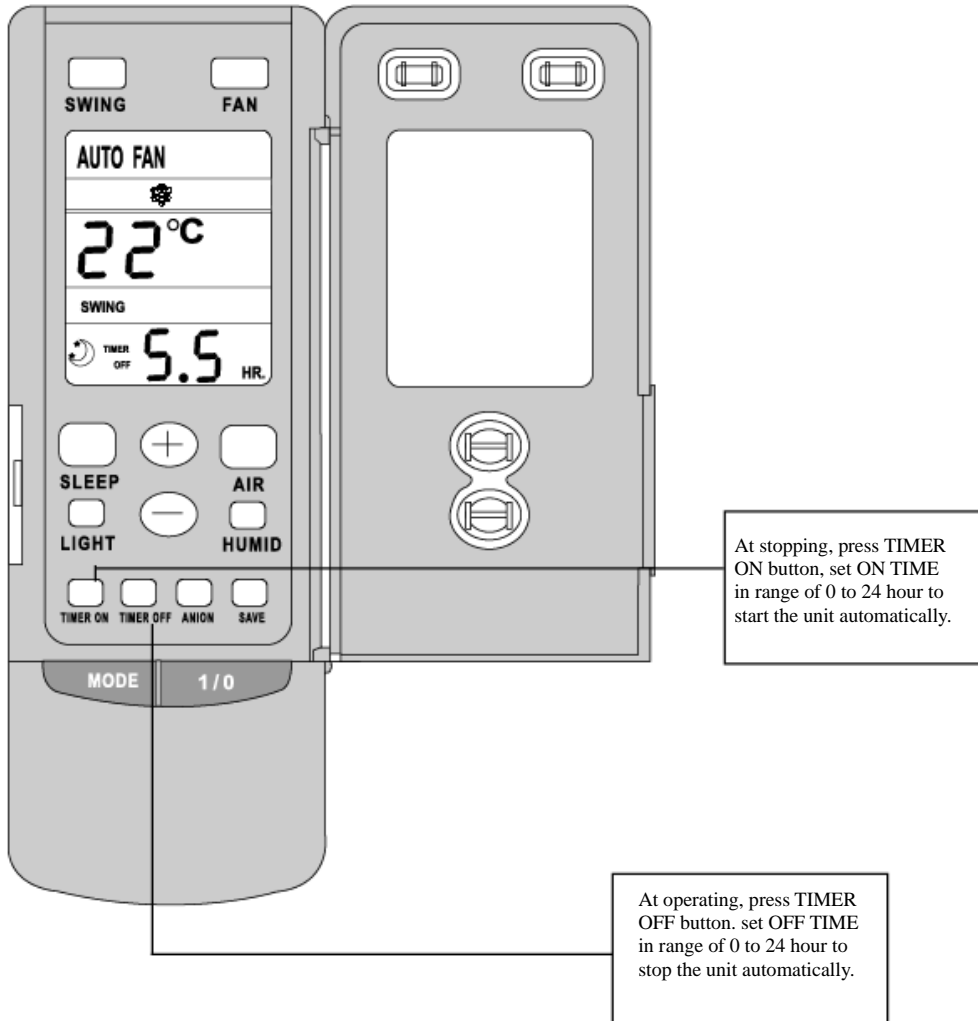


AUTO mode operation procedure

- At AUTO mode operation, standard SET TEMP. is 25°C for COOL mode and 20°C for HEAT mode.



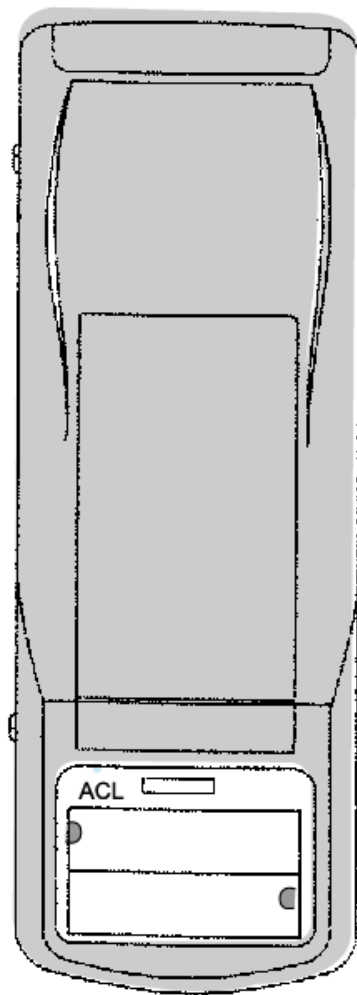

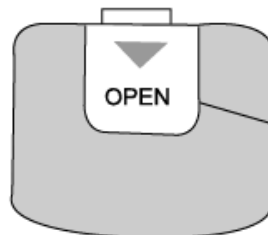
How to insert batteries

- The remote control signal can be received at a distance of up to about 10m.



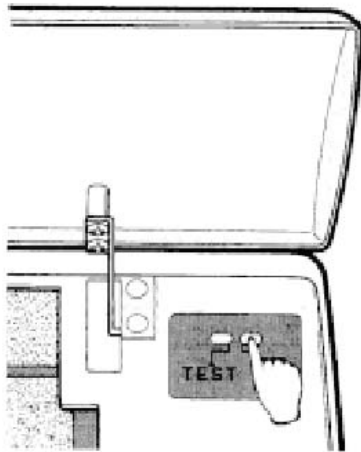

Emergency Operation procedure

You can operate your TECO without the controller, by opening the fascia panel and operate as follows:



Start

At stopping, press AUTO button, start the air conditioner at AUTO mode operation.

*According to room temp. change, microcomputer can automatically set COOL or HEAT or DRY operation mode, so as for best effect.
*The OPERATION indicator keeps light while compressor runs.

Stop

At operation, press AUTO Button , stop the air conditioner.

*Both indoor unit and outdoor unit stop at the same time.

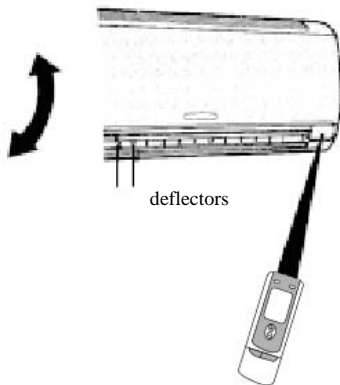
*The left TEST button is only for testing air conditioner. When it is pressed, no matter what room temp. is, air conditioner keeps cooling, so do not use it for normally operation.

Air flow direction adjustment procedure

1. Adjusting up/down air flow direction

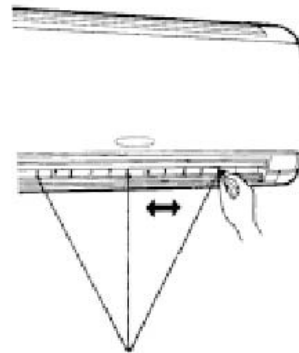
Using the remote controller, adjust air flow direction by rotating the UP/DOWN deflectors up and down automatically or stopping at an angle.

- * Press SWING button, the deflectors start to rotate and stop when repress.
- * Press DIRE button once or for a moment, the deflectors move a special angle except they are rotating automatically.



As shown, move the LEFT/RIGHT deflectors by hand, adjust air flow left or right or three different directions to every corner of room so as to make everywhere temp . average.



Care and maintenance


Cleaning filters

1. Open surface panel only after air conditioner stops completely


- ① Pull here up (both sides of the surface panel)
- ② Push filters up till hooks are free
- ③ Pull down and take out filters.



2. Clean filters with a vacuum cleaner or by typing them gently. If they are very Dirty, wash them in warm water below 40°C dissolved with neutral scouring agent, then dry them in cool air.




3. Insert them at original position, then push down and close surface panel.



* Check air inlet and outlet of outdoor unit.






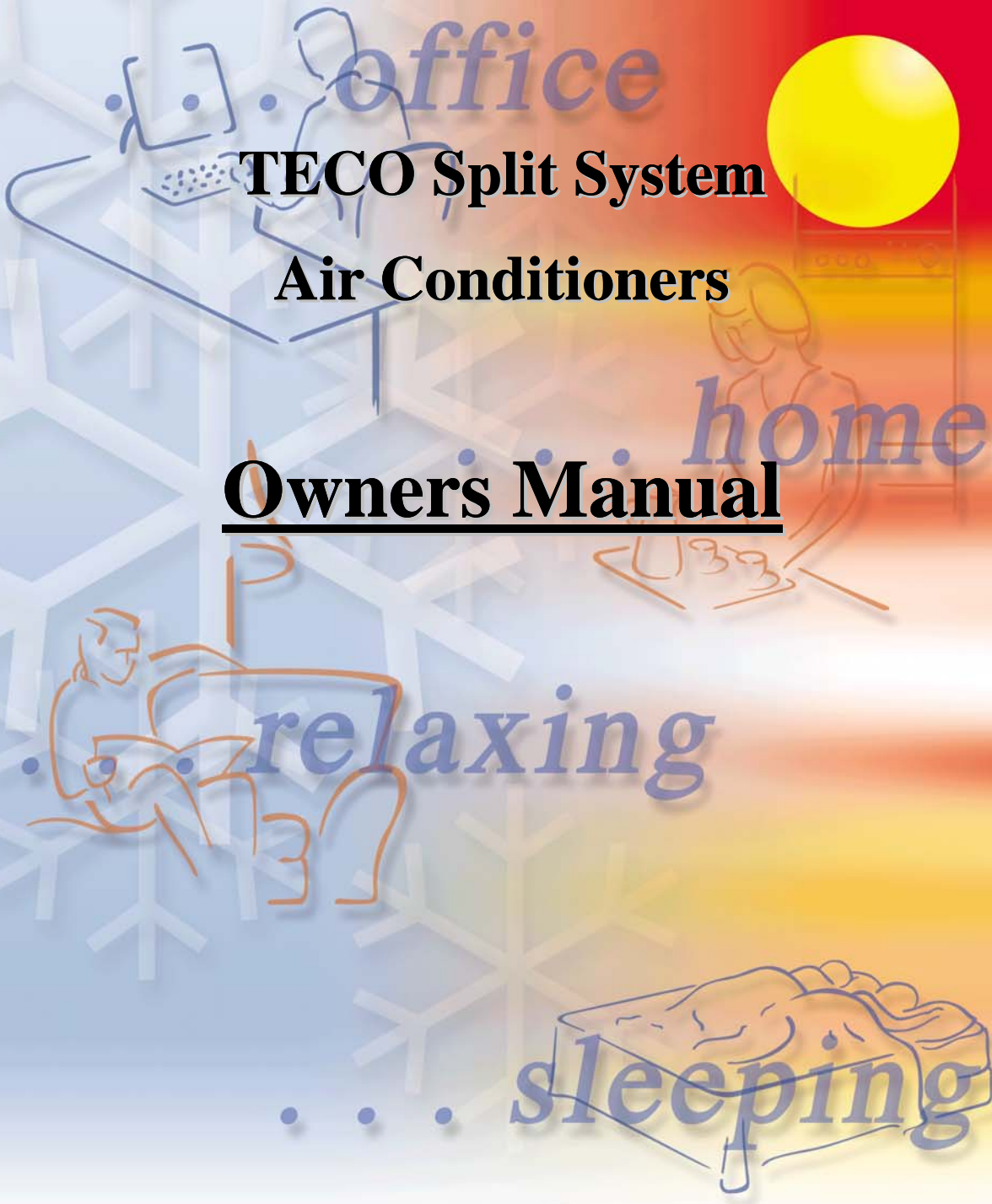

<p>Air conditioner does not operate at all.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Is power fail? * Is plug out? * Is power fuse or switch off? * Is voltage higher than 240V or lower than 206V? * Is SET TIME suitable?
<p>Cooling efficiency is not good.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Is air inlet or outlet locking? * Is there any other heat source in room? * Are air filters dirty very much? * Is indoor fan speed set at LOW? * Is SET TEMP. suitable?
<p>Wireless remote controller is not available.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * If disturbed abnormally or operation modes changed too frequently, sometimes the electric controller would lose function. Please plug out and plug in again, it maybe OK. * Check batteries of wireless remote controller, if voltage is little, change batteries. * If wireless remote controller displays unclear or displays all symbols, please change batteries.
<p>Foggy air flows out.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * At COOL or DRY mode operation, sometimes there is foggy air flowing out of indoor unit, this is because that room humid air has been cooling rapid.

Immediately stop all operations and plug out, contact with your seller in the following situations.

- * Operation starts or stops abnormally;
- * Power fuse or switch often breaks;
- * Carelessly splash water or something into air conditioner;
- * Electrical lines are much hot or lines cover breaks;
- * Other strange situations.

VGA: For PC display. Connect it to the D-Sub 15 pins analog output connector of the PC.

PC audio in: Connect it to the audio output terminal of PC.

Basic Operation

Press the Power button on the TV or the remote control, then press the TV/AV button to select DVD mode. If there is no disc in the DVD player the screen will show "NO DISC".

Insert Disc according to picture next to disc slot.

Do not touch the playing surface.

Hold the disc around the outside with your fingers and place the disc into the slot. The player will automatically draw the disc into the player.

To "Eject" the disc, press the EJECT button on the TV or the "▲" button on the remote control.

Troubleshooting

No power

- Make sure the TV and the power cord are connected correctly.
- Check if you pressed POWER on the remote control unit. If the indicator in the front panel is red, press POWER on the remote control or the front control panel.

LCD TV does not operate

- External influences such as lightning or static electricity may cause improper operation. In this case, operate the unit after first turning on the power, or unplugging the AC cord and plugging it in again after 1 to 2 minutes.

Power is cut off suddenly

- Check if the off timer or sleep timer are set.
- The unit's internal temperature has increased. Remove any objects blocking the vents and clean them to remove dust.

Remote control unit does not operate

- Check if the batteries are inserted with the polarity(+, -)correctly aligned.
- Check if the batteries are discharged. Please replace with new batteries.
- Make sure that you do not use the remote control under strong or fluorescent lighting.
- Check if there is a fluorescent light illuminated near the remote control sensor.
- The path of the remote control beam may be blocked; please make sure the path is clear and that remote control is aimed at the remote control sensor in the TV.

Picture is cut off /with side bar screen

- Check if the image position is correct.
- Check if the screen mode adjustments such as picture size are set correctly.

Strange colour, light colour, or colour misalignment

- Is the room too bright? The picture may look dark in a room that is too bright.
- Check the input signal setting.

CAUTION: If the set is not going to be used for a long period, such as during a vacation, remove the plug from the wall outlet to economise power. (If the TV set is plugged in, a slight current still flows, even the power button is in OFF position.)

Handling the LCD screen

- Direct sunlight on the LCD screen can cause damage to the screen. Take care when you are placing the television near a window.

- on a wall, upside down or upright, using the included mounting kit.
- on top of a front load washing machine (using a stacking kit available as an optional extra).

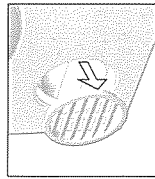
The appliance must not be installed behind a lockable door, a sliding door or a door with a hinge on the opposite side to that of the tumble dryer in such a way that a full opening of the tumble dryer door is restricted.

Stacking Kit

You can use a stacking kit if you want to mount your dryer on top of a Simpson front load washing machine. Use the kit part number DKSK03. Refer to the kit instructions on how to install.



The exhaust grille has a range of positions, which allows you to select the optimum exhaust air angle. Simply hold the grille and rotate it until it hits the built-in stop.



Name Badge

You can invert the name badge when you want to mount your dryer upside down on the wall. Use a suitable tool (such as a thin bladed tool). Unclip the badge from the panel, invert and clip back.

Do not install your dryer in a cupboard or small un-vented laundry unless you are using a venting kit.

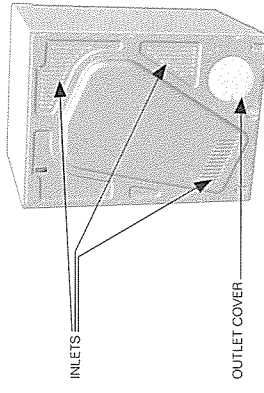

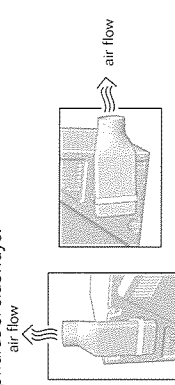

Important: Use only kits approved by Electrolux Home Products Pty Ltd with your dryer. Contact the Electrolux Home Products Pty. Ltd. Spare Parts Centre for the list of approved kits. The exhaust duct must not exceed 2 metres in length and 100mm in diameter.
 If connecting the dryer to a common ducting system, safety advice should be requested from the manufacturer.

If you choose to use an optional vent kit, the exhaust grille at the front of the dryer will need to be replaced with the outlet cover from the back of the dryer. Gently prise open the grille, using a thin bladed tool. Next, remove the cover from the back and clip it into the grille space at the front. The exhaust grille is not required when using a vent kit.



You can position the vent kit at the back of the dryer to remove air upwards or sideways.

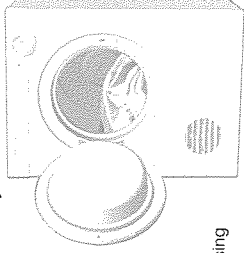


Inlet and outlet points need clear airflow to prevent overheating, so ensure there is adequate ventilation. (i.e. open window or external door.)

If a venting kit is used and the exhaust is discharged out of the room, there must be adequate ventilation to avoid the back flow of gases into the room from appliances burning other fuels, including open fires, when operating the tumble dryer. This is not applicable where a venting hose is directed to an open window. The exhaust air must not be discharged into a flue which is used for exhausting fumes from appliances burning gas or other fuels.

Quick 5 Step Operating Guide

1 Load your dryer loosely until it is no more than **TWO THIRDS FULL**. Clothes must tumble freely in a dryer. Don't cram them in. Wet clothes fluff up when dry.

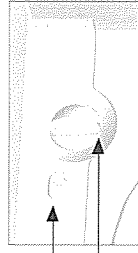


Overloading will:

- Reduce efficiency
- Increase drying time
- Increase the risk of creasing

Do not load clothes or other articles which are dripping wet into your dryer.

2 Select one of the two (2) temperature settings.



- **'Warm'** for delicate items which can shrink, such as synthetics, underwear, etc.
- **'Hot'** for heavy, durable items such as towels and flannelette sheets.

Useful Hints

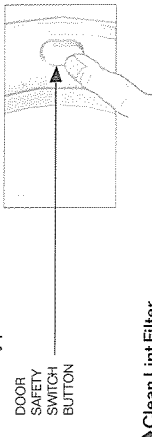
- Never tumble dry the following: Delicate items such as net curtains, woollen, silk, fabric with metal trim, nylon tights, bulky materials such as anoraks, blankets, eiderdown sleeping bags, feather quilts and any item containing rubber foam or materials similar to foam rubber.
- Do not place in your dryer undergarments such as bras and corsets that contain metal reinforcements. Your dryer may be damaged if metal parts were to come loose from the garment. Place such items in a bag designed for this purpose.
- For nylon socks and other small light items, place them in a bag designed for this purpose. This will stop these items being caught in the lint filter cavity.
- Check and empty pockets. Clips, pens, nails and pins can damage both the dryer and your clothes. Other items such as matches or cigarette lighters will cause a fire.
- Close all press studs, hooks, eyes and zips that may catch on something else. Tie all belts and apron strings to prevent tangling.
- Drying time will depend on fabric type and construction, load size and wetness. Save time and money and always spin the load as dry as possible in your washing machine.

3 Select the drying time.

Turn the knob control in the direction of the arrow only (clockwise). Turning the knob in opposite direction (counter-clockwise) will damage the timer. This damage will not be covered by product warranty.

4 Switch On

The dryer will not operate unless the safety button on the door is fully pressed in.



5 Clean Lint Filter

After every load clean the lint filter located at the front of your dryer to reduce drying times and avoid overheating.

STANDARD FEATURES

Reversing Action

The drum is designed to turn one minute in each direction, clockwise and anti-clockwise. This reduces tangling and gives more even drying in a shorter time.

Cooling Down

At the end of the drying cycle, there is automatically a time of no heat, to cool down the load and minimise creasing.

- Drying time will also be affected by voltage fluctuations, room temperature and humidity. Clothes will dry more slowly on a cool or humid day.
 - For best results, sort the load according to fabric types. Such as heavy items which may take longer to dry, eg towels, flannelette sheets etc, than ones which dry quickly, eg poly/cotton shirts and sheets.
 - Avoid drying dark clothes with light coloured items such as towels as lint will show on the dark clothes.
- Note: Some fabrics will collect lint from other clothes and items. Separate the lint 'givers' and the lint 'collectors' to minimise this problem.**
 Clothes that give lint include towels, nappies, chenille. Clothes that collect lint include corduroy, synthetics and permanent press garments.
- If individual items are still damp after drying, set a 30 minute post drying time. This will be necessary particularly for multilayered items (eg collars, pockets, etc).
 - Always clean the lint filter - this will reduce drying time and save you money.

Useful Hints, Troubleshooting & Accessories

USEFUL HINTS (continued)

- The laundry must be thoroughly spun before tumble drying.
- Easy-care items eg shirts, should be briefly pre-spun before drying (depending on the crease resistance approximately 30 seconds)
- To avoid static charge when drying is completed, use either a fabric softener when you are washing the laundry or a fabric conditioner specifically for tumble dryers.
- Remove the laundry when the dryer has finished drying.
- Do not over-dry laundry, this avoids creasing and saves energy.
- Clothes or towels containing sand or grit should be washed first.

To help you, here is a list of the average weights of some common laundry items.

Tablecloth	400 - 500g
Kitchen towel	70 - 120g
Table napkin	50 - 100g
Towelling hand towel	150 - 250g
Bathrobe	1000 - 1500g

Men's pyjamas	400 - 500g
Ladies nightdress	200 - 250g
Bath towel	300 - 400g

TROUBLESHOOTING

Check the points listed here before you call for help, and make sure that you have followed the **Important Safety Information** on pages 2 & 3.

If you can't start your dryer, check these probable causes.

- Plug is not firmly in socket, or power not turned on.
- You have blown a fuse. Check that power point with another appliance.
- You have not closed the dryer door or pushed in the door safety switch button.
- You have not turned the control knob to the setting you want.

If your clothes are still wet:

- The selected drying time was insufficient. Turn the control knob to a longer time setting.
- Longer time may be needed when the room temperature is 10°C or less.
- Check that the lint filter is not blocked.
- Check to see that you have read all the instructions carefully.
- Contact the Service Centre if you are still having problems. Write down the model and serial numbers and the date of purchase before you ring. The Service Centre will need this information.

Important

To operate efficiently the clothes dryer must have an unrestricted air supply and exhaust ventilation.

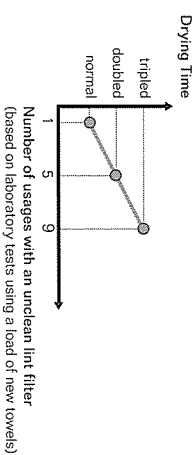

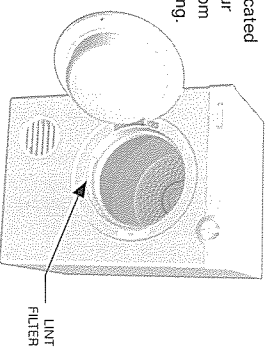
LINT BUILD-UP IS A FIRE HAZARD

A clean lint filter reduces drying times, saves energy and avoids overheating. Overheating may also damage your clothes.

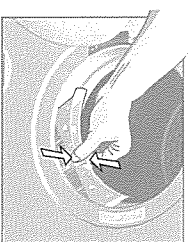
What happens if I forget to clean the lint filter?



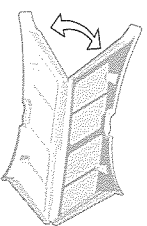
The lint filter is located at the front of your dryer at the bottom of the door opening.



You must clean this lint filter after every load.



To remove the lint filter open the door and press the two pads together. Pull the lint filter out of the pocket.



Open apart the lint filter and wipe or peel off the lint. Ensure the lint filter 'clicks' when replacing. It can be inserted into the pocket either way.

- Never operate your dryer without the lint filter.
- Do not allow lint to build up around your dryer.
- A torn or damaged lint filter must be replaced immediately.
- Overloading can increase lint build-up because the airflow is reduced.

To avoid potential fire hazards, we recommend that you pay a qualified service technician to periodically clean your dryer. You must do this also when you change your mounting from upright to inverted, or vice versa.

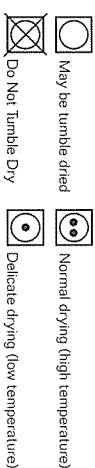
DRYING GUIDE

Your load, when dry must not exceed the rated capacity.

- 4kg for the 4kg Machine
- 5kg for the 5kg Machine
- 6kg for the 6kg Machine

(See page 6 for a table of average weights of laundry items)

Always check your labels for the drying symbols which the International Care Labelling Code now uses.



Permanent press and synthetics - take out as soon as the dryer stops to reduce wrinkles.

- Woollen articles - not recommended. Pull them to their original shape, then dry them flat.
- Woven and loop knit materials - may shrink, by varying amounts, depending on their quality. Do not use the 'hot' setting for these fabrics. Always stretch them out immediately after drying.

Fibre or leather materials - always check the manufacturer's instructions.

Baby clothes and night gowns - acrylic clothing or sleepwear use only on the 'warm' setting.

- Rubber and plastics - Do not dry any items made from or containing rubber or plastics, such as aprons, bibs, babies' water-proof napkins, curtains, tablecloths, shower caps, clothes fitted with foam rubber pads, pillows, galoshes, or rubber coated tennis shoes.

Fibreglass - not recommended. Glass particles left in the dryer could be picked up by your clothes the next time you use the dryer, and irritate your skin.

- During the drying cycle, if you want to
 - add or take out clothes, or
 - check the dryness of the load,
 turn down the timer to 'Airring' for at least one minute before opening the door. This is to prevent scorching or possible self combustion of the fabric.

Fabric softeners or similar products should not be used in a tumble dryer to eliminate the effects of static electricity unless this practice is specifically recommended by the manufacturer of the fabric softener or product.

Note: We strongly advise against the use of fabric conditioners of the sheet type that are added to the clothes in the drum. These products may lead to rapid blockages of the lint filter and inefficient operation of your dryer.

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Conditions of Use

This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:

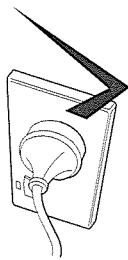
- Farm Houses.
 - By citizens in serviced apartments, holiday apartments and other residential type environments.
- It must not be used for purposes other than those for which it was designed.

Important Safety Instructions

DRYER SAFETY

Failure to follow these safety instructions could damage the dryer or your clothes. You may then not be covered by warranty for this damage.

Only plug this appliance directly into an AC power supply, which is properly earthed and has the correct voltage. See the serial number sticker located on the top of the door opening for voltage information.



CAUTION: If this appliance is supplied from a cord extension set or electrical portable outlet device, the cord extension set or electrical portable outlet device must be positioned so that it is not subject to splashing or ingress of moisture. For safety reasons we strongly advise against the use of double adaptors, extension cords or power boards.



This tumble dryer is not intended for use by young children or infirm persons without supervision. Young children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

IMPORTANT: If the electrical cord of this appliance is damaged, it must be replaced by the Manufacturer, Authorised Service Agent or similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.

These dryers are for drying clothes, towels and linen at home. Do not use them for any other purpose.

FIRE HAZARDS

Some fabrics are not suitable for tumble drying. The following **MUST NOT** be placed in your dryer due to the risk of a fire or an explosion:

- Items that have been spotted or soaked with vegetable oil, cooking oil, sultan oil, linseed oil, salad oil, lubrication oil or grease. Oil affected items can ignite spontaneously, especially when exposed to heat sources such as in a tumble dryer. The items become warm, causing an oxidation reaction in the oil. Oxidation creates heat. If heat cannot escape, the items can become hot enough to ignite. Piling, stacking, or storing oil-affected items can prevent heat from escaping and create a fire hazard. If it is unavoidable that fabrics that contain vegetable or cooking oil, or have been contaminated by hair care products be placed in a tumble dryer, they should first be washed in hot water with extra detergent. This will reduce, but not eliminate the hazard. The 'cool down' cycle of tumble dryers should be used to reduce the temperature of the items. They should not be removed from the tumble dryer or piled while hot.

- Items that have previously been cleaned in, washed in, or spotted with petrol/gasoline, industrial chemicals used only for cleaning, dry-cleaning solvents or other flammable or explosive substances. Highly flammable substances commonly found around the house include acetone, (nail polish remover) denatured alcohol, petrol/gasoline, kerosene, some spot removers, turpentine, waxes and wax removers. Items containing foam rubber (also known as latex foam) or similarly textured rubber-like materials. Foam rubber materials can produce fire by spontaneous combustion when heated.

- Rubber-backed articles, clothes fitted with foam rubber pads, pillows, rubber boots and rubber-coated sports shoes.

For your safety, and to reduce the risk of fire or an explosion, **DO NOT** store or use petrol or other inflammable vapours and liquids near your dryer.

- In this warranty, 'acceptable quality' as referred to in clause 10 of this warranty has the same meaning referred to in the ACLI.
- 'ACLI' means Trade Practices Amendment (Australian Consumer Law) Act (No.2) 2010.
- 'Appliance' means any Electrolux product purchased by you accompanied by this document;
- 'ASC' means Electrolux' authorised service centres;
- 'Electrolux' means Electrolux Home Products Pty Ltd of 163 O'Riordan Street, Mascot, NSW 2020, ABN 51 004 762 341, in respect of Appliances purchased in Australia and Electrolux (NZ) Limited of 3-5 Niall Burgess Road, Mount Wellington, in respect of Appliances purchased in New Zealand;
- 'major failure' as referred to in clause 10 of this warranty has the same meaning referred to in the ACLI, and includes a situation when an Appliance cannot be repaired or it is uneconomic for Electrolux, at its discretion, to repair an Appliance during the Warranty Period;
- 'Warranty Period' means:
 - where the Appliance is used for personal, domestic or household use (i.e. normal single family use) as set out in the instruction manual, the Appliance is warranted against manufacturing defects in Australia for 12 months and in New Zealand for 24 months, following the date of original purchase of the Appliance;
 - where the Appliance is used for commercial purposes (including being used to directly assist a business or where the Appliance is used in a multi-family communal or share type environment), the Appliance will then be warranted against manufacturing defects in Australia for 3 months and in New Zealand for 3 months, following the date of original purchase of the Appliance;
 - 'you' means the purchaser of the Appliance not having purchased the Appliance for re-sale, and 'your' has a corresponding meaning.

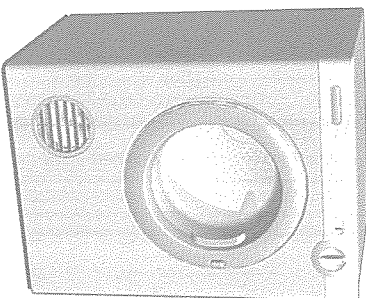
