Our contractor collects recycling materials in a separate truck to general waste. It is delivered to a materials recycling facility where it is sorted, prepared and sold on to the market.



What is happening with recycling in the Town of Victoria Park?

A change is happening to recycling in the Town of Victoria Park, a change for the better! The current recycling crate system is being replaced with 240 litre yellow top recycling bin system.

Why a change?

This change has occurred due to a combination of environmental concerns, working towards 'Zero Waste', the cost of waste-to-landfill and community demand. It allows for larger amounts of recycling, more convenient placement on the kerb, and easier pick-up by our waste collection contractors.

So how will this happen?

Your black recycling crate/s will be replaced with a yellow top recycling bin in February 2009. For the vast majority of residential properties within the Town there will be no change, except that you will have a yellow top recycling bin.



What will I receive?

In February 2009, a yellow top recycling bin will arrive for you along with a recycling guide calendar. The new system will be very easy to use, with a weekly pick-up for general rubbish and a **fortnightly pick-up** for recycling.

What happens to my recycling crate?

You are welcome to keep and reuse your crate/s if you wish for personal use – or if you would prefer, you can return your crate/s to us at the Town's Depot at 199 Star St, Welshpool.

Delivery of new recycling bins and recycling guide calendars

Multi-unit Dwellings

Multi-unit dwellings are subject to different procedures to single unit dwellings.

In a multi-unit development, where it is impractical for each dwelling unit to be provided with its own bin, the Town will provide fewer bins and organise more frequent pick-ups. The Town will determine the number of bins and collection frequency to be provided.
